complicated transmission of shame and responsibility. I draw on autobiographical
memory and clinical examples as a second-generation German-Canadian psycho-
analyst to consider the impact of German cultural identity on the practice of
psychoanalysis in the German-Jewish experience. Using a perspective grounded in
philosophical hermeneutics and psychoanalysis, I illustrate the personal, psycho-
logical, and political ramifications of Germany's "unmasterable past" and consider
the impact of Germany's role as the perpetrator of the Holocaust for subsequent
generations and across geographical contexts.

In a lecture given in 1979, "What Does Coming to Terms with the Past Mean?" the
philosopher, Theodor Adorno (1959/1986), addressed the urgent need for Germans to
remember and confront the orchestrated horrors of the Holocaust. For a nation once
known as *das Land der Dichter und Denker* (nation of poets and philosophers), Adorno
(1979/1986) argued that the psychoanalytic process of remembering and working through
was essential to the emergence of a collective memory and responsibility. According to
Adorno, the possibility for political change and historical awareness was directly tied to
the psychoanalytic process of self-reflection, whether on an individual or societal level. It
